

Men's Club


is an active segment of the synagogue which promotes philanthropic, spiritual and social activities for it's members and the synagogue at large.





Always follow the instructions of the Rabbi, security officers and synagogue staff.

High Holy Day Tickets must be displayed for entrance to the building, even if the greeters know and recognize you.

Parking along Dillon Rd. is no longer allowed for security considerations. Overflow parking is available at the Korean Church across the street.

Be aware of your surroundings. Know the location of appropriate emergency exits. See diagram and instructions below.

Report suspicious activity in or around the synagogue. Focus on the person's behavior, not their appearance.

Please leave any bags in your vehicles except for tallit bags and small handbags. Do not touch suspicious or unattended bags or packages.

The Main Entrance will be the only point of entry and normal exit to the building.

Youth, including teens, wandering the building unsupervised is a safety and security risk and is not allowed.

Please thank the Upper Dublin Police Officers and private security guards for helping to keep us safe on these High Holy Days and throughout the year!

ENSURE YOU ARE ACQUAINTED WITH THESE EVACUATION PROCEDURES!

In the event of an emergency evacuation of the building, follow these evacuation instructions. Upon exiting the building, our evacuation assembly area is the Dresher Estates senior living facility just south of Temple Sinai. DO NOT assemble in the Temple Sinai parking lot as this will impede first responders and is a potential security risk. If you have children engaged in the youth programming or babysitting, do NOT go to get them. Their caregivers will escort the youth to Dresher Estates where you will be able to reunite with them.

Main Sanctuary – Exit through the emergency exits at the front of room, utilizing the doors on the side closest to you. If you are seated towards the back of the left side of the Sanctuary, the closest exit may be the doors leading to the Sukkah area. Do not remain in the Sukkah area.

Foyer and Social Hall – Exit through the Main Entrance to the building or the doors leading to the Sukkah depending upon which are the closest to you. Do not remain in the Sukkah area. Unless otherwise directed by Rabbi Wohlberg, security officers, Temple Sinai staff, or volunteers wearing security vests, do not attempt to leave through the back door to the School wing



by the Confirmation pictures. Congestion would arise due to the narrow hallway as well as impeding the children leaving from the school wing.

Chapel – Exit through the front Chapel door.

Library – Exit through the school entrance.

Notify us immediately of any persons you know who have not reached the assembly point and who may still be in the building. Do not return to the building or your cars until the all-clear has been given by official personnel.


