Can We Count On You?

Hoshia et amecha u-varech et nachalatecha u-r'eim v-nas'eim ad ha-olam (Ps.28:9). (Save Your people and bless Your inheritance,

tend them and elevate them forever.)

Sound familiar? You may recognize this verse as the lyrics to a popular Jewish song sung in the synagogue, most often, on *Simchat Torah*. It also happens to be a phrase utilized in synagogues as a counting mechanism. Really. Count the number of words in the verse. How many are there? Ten. How many Jewish adults are needed for a *minyan*? Ten.

According to Jewish tradition, we are not supposed to count people. As a result, the practice developed of using a verse with 10 words in it when counting to see if there are sufficient people to make up a *minyan*. From where does this prohibition on using numbers to count people derive?

“The Talmud understood Hosea’s prophecy (2:1)—“The number of people of Israel shall be like that of the sands of the sea, which cannot be measured or counted”—as both a blessing and a prohibition (Yoma 22b),” writes Ronald L. Eisenberg in *The JPS Guide to Jewish Traditions*.

There are two occasions in the Torah when God commands Moses to take a census of the people. But when King David orders an “unauthorized” census of the people, a terrible plague ensues. That is why the Talmud decrees: “Israel must not be counted [using numbers], even for religious purposes.”

Today, if you are one of the first to arrive for a service, you are likely to hear the *minyan*

leader counting not necessarily by means of a verse, but in another way that has become a common practice: “Not one, not two, not three . . .” In this way, no individual is assigned a number, and, hopefully, we have no need to fear a plague!

It is almost comical that we have created this fictitious form of counting—telling people as they come through the door that they are “Not one” or “Not two” —when we know how difficult it can be at times to assemble a *minyan*’s worth of people. Every individual does count, and we count on everyone to help ensure that a *minyan* will be present for all of our services.

Our morning *minyan*, thank God, is generally well-attended, although we could always use a few more. Assembling 10 people for our evening *minyan* is oftentimes a challenge, and there have been times when we have fallen short. It is unfortunate that a congregation of our size struggles to ensure that a service can take place and that those who come to say Kaddish will have that opportunity.

Many people have said to me: “Call me if you ever need another person for a *minyan*.” I have made such calls when additional people were needed, so have our *minyan* leaders. And today, thanks to technology, we also have an app that allows us to reach a group of people all at once. If you haven’t already signed-up to receive such alerts from the synagogue, please contact Edy and share with her your cell phone number.

Even better, however, would be your making a commitment to attend an evening service—Monday through Wednesday—or a morning service—Sunday through Friday—once-a-week or even once-a-month—without having to be called or texted. A daily *minyan* is one of the most important things that our synagogue—any synagogue—can offer. It would be great to know that we can count on you!



This will be my last column to you as Cantor of Temple Sinai. I will have more to say at the "Farewell Shabbat" in my honor on May 18; I look forward to seeing you there.

In brief, I am grateful for having had the opportunity of to serveing the congregation that Rabbi Sidney Greenberg, zichrono liv'racha, built literally from the ground up, and of following in the footsteps of my esteemed predecessor, Cantor Nathan Chaitovsky.

I am boundlessly optimistic about my future as Randi and I remain in the area we have called home for thirty and nineteen years, respectively.

We both wish only the best for Temple Sinai in the years ahead.

As I walk through the school wing, the first thing I notice are the changes in our children. Babies who started in September are now crawling along, toddlers are telling me their names and all their friends names, two year olds are singing and chatting nonstop, three year olds are excited to be the “big kids” and, of course, our Pre K are prepared to start their next journey in Kindergarten. It is truly astounding how children can change so drastically from the first day of school until the last day. There is such beauty in watching children flourish throughout the ten months.

As a parent, there are so many ups and downs to raising our children. I listen all the time about children fighting to go to bed, refusing to get dressed in the morning, tantrums at the store or not putting their coat on when it is cold outside. I have two children and I feel your pain. In the moment, these disputes seem massive and can be maddening for a parent, but know it is also the greatest time for your child. Children are learning to be independent, become their own individual personalities, test their limits and figure out their world. Each day, and each action they take, they are developing a sense of self. As educators we experience the same matters in the classroom, but we recognize there is so much more to be revealed in these little emerging minds. Each day, our children are eager to learn something new. It might be trying a new food from the Snack Sack, completing a massive tower, growing vegetables in the garden, learning a song or dance and making

best friends. This is all happening while they are trying to become their own individual people. It’s a lot of work being a little kid!!

What do I love most about our school? We are a small school, in numbers, with an abundance of love for our children and families. When you walk into our school, to drop off your child, this is your community. We want your children to become the best of who they can be, but we encourage you to learn from what they bring home. Our wish is for you to make long lasting friendships, our desire is to inspire your love of Judaism and we hope at the end of the year we have added something meaningful to your life.

Thank you for allowing us to take care of your children and play an integral part of who they will become as they grow into adulthood. Preschool might only be a few years, but these years play an integral part in a child’s life.

I wish you a summer filled with fun filled family times. Don’t forget about us, over the summer, as we still have some terrific family fun programs.

Here is some Food for Thought...

“More than 120,000 seniors have trouble paying for life’s most basic necessities.

13,000 older Philadelphians need help preparing meals; 73% live alone; 40% rarely leave their home.

Aid For Friends is one of the largest and most established home delivered meals program in Pennsylvania, serving 300,000 free dinner meals, 58,000 soups and 42,000 breakfast bags to an aggregate 1,700 home-bound persons each year.” (www.aidforfriends.org)

Temple Sinai’s Food for Thought class has contributed at least 100 meals, 150 breakfast bags and 50 containers of soup to Aid For Friends, the organization mentioned above. This past year, I have held almost monthly gatherings with 6 amazing high school seniors to prepare meals for the food insecure elderly. These teens have worked hard


to help prepare and cook meals all while spending time with each other, as many of them do not go to the same high school. The meals we have prepared follow the guidelines provided by Aid For Friends. Each meal we make is packaged in a metal pan with spots for a main course, a side dish and dessert. We use our creativity to make vegetarian meals including: quinoa stuffed peppers, eggplant parmigiana, baked ziti and shepherd’s pie using a soy based meat substitute. These are just a few of the recipes we have made!

I have been facilitating this class at Temple Sinai for 3 years, and many of the participants have been in it since I started. While I am sad that my time with these teens is coming to an end, my hope is they will continue to stay involved in social action. Food for Thought will begin again in Fall 2019. If you know a teen who is interested in participating, please feel free to reach out!

It's hard to believe that this school year has come to a close! It was another wonderful year of learning (and fun!) for our students. I'm already hard at work planning to make next year the best it can be.

As you know, next year will bring many changes to Temple Sinai, including the Religious School. Change can be very hard and even scary at times, but it also provides a unique opportunity to reflect on what we are doing and how we can do it better. This is the approach I will be taking with the Religious School/Sinai High/Education programs as we enter the 5780 school year.

I want to take this opportunity to lay out part of the vision of the Education department moving forward. I want the school to be a joyful, fun, thriving, upbeat environment. I want the children in this community to be proud of their Jewish identity and comfortable in a prayer and learning community. Students will have the opportunity to interact and learn from their teachers and clergy on a regular basis. They will celebrate and learn about Jewish holidays in "real time", they will learn to read and write Hebrew, learn about our Torah and history, Israel, Jewish values and more. They will be given the chance to participate in impactful programs both within Temple Sinai and outside of the building. I will continue to utilize the best practices in the fields of formal and informal education, networking with educators and learning from my colleagues. The teachers will continue to partake in professional development and bring their unique personalities to the content they teach.

I'm pleased to share some exciting changes to our program. The music curriculum will be revised over the summer, with the infusion of songs widely sung at Jewish camps and by contempo-

rary musicians. The Yad Squad program will also be revamped with an emphasis on smaller group learning and more one-on-one attention to the students. The students will learn the content and meaning of the prayers, as well as the different parts of the Shabbat and weekday services. I'm looking forward to sharing the rest of the details over the summer.

This is a great time for you as parents to get more involved in the school community. The Religious School Committee and PTO has grown every year and continues to provide vital support and resources to our program. Please consider joining one of our committees and lending your voice to enhance our programming.

I want to thank Marla Kepniss and Jen Barrer, the Religious School Committee Chair and PTO President, for their leadership and support. Thank you parents for encouraging your children to learn and for showing them how important a Jewish education is. I'm looking forward to visiting many children this summer at various Jewish overnight camps and seeing members of the congregation at Temple Sinai and around the community.

Shavuot at Temple Sinai

Exactly 49 days after the start of *Pesach*, we celebrate the second of the three pilgrimage festivals – *Shavuot* (the name means “weeks”). The holiday is mentioned in the Torah as taking place seven weeks (thus the name) after the first grain has been harvested. The holiday has agricultural significance because it was the time when the first fruits were harvested and brought to the Temple and for that reason the holiday has a second name *Chag ha-Bikkurim* (the Festival of the First Fruits). Once the Holy Temple was destroyed and offerings were no longer part of Jewish worship, the rabbis gave Shavuot new significance by declaring it to be the date on which the Jewish People stood at Mt. Sinai as God gave them the Torah. For that reason, the holiday is also called *Chag Matan Torateinu* (the Festival of the Giving of Our Torah).

Shavuot, is celebrated for two days outside of Israel and it is customary to spend the first night engaged in study throughout the entire night. The night of study is called a *Tikkun Leyl Shavuot*. The following day, the Torah reading in the synagogue contains the 10 Commandments. On the second day of the holiday, the *Yizkor* service is recited, allowing worshippers to remember loved ones.

There is a long-standing tradition of eating dairy foods on *Shavuot*. Recalling the holiday’s connection to the Land of Israel, dairy foods are reminder that the Torah refers to Israel as a land flowing with “milk and honey.”
